the lawful Widow of Francis Locke, late of Epsom  
above named. That the said Francis Locke died  
on the 6th day of March A.D. 1835, that he was a  
Revolutionary Pensioner of the United States at the  
time of his death.

I Francis Locke of Exeter in the County of Rockingham  
Lan and State of New Hampshire, testify and declare, that in  
the month of April 1775 I enlisted as a private Soldier for the term  
of eight months in the revolutionary war against Great Britain  
in a Company Commanded by Captain Henry Dearborn in  
Colonel John Stark's Regiment in the New Hampshire Line  
that I served the eight months, and then without returning  
home again enlisted for the term of twelve months in the  
same Company and Regiment that I before served in,  
in the Continental establishment - that after faithfully serving  
the full one year the term I had enlisted for, I was regu-  
larly discharged and left the service which discharge is now  
missing and cannot be found, and I further declare that being  
far advanced in years I am not able to obtain a Support by  
manual labour and have no other way of Acquiring a living  
and by reason of my reduced circumstances stand in need  
of assistance from my Country for Support of Francis Locke  
April 14<sup>th</sup>. 1818

ON this 29<sup>th</sup> day of June — A. D. 1820 personally appeared

before Hallburying Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in the county of Rockingham being a Court of Record, in and for the said county, having the power of fine and imprisonment, Francis Lock of Epsom aged ~~sixty five~~ years, resident in Epsom in said county, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War, as follows: viz.

That in the Month of April 1775 he enlisted as a private soldier for the term of eight months in the Revolutionary war against Great Britain in a Company then commanded by Capt Henry Drayton in Col. John Stark's Regt in the Newhampshire line that he served the eight months and then without returning home again enlisted for twelve months in the same Company & Regt that he first served in and in the Continental ~~the~~ army that after serving the term he enlisted for he was regularly discharged & left the service which will appear by my declaration made April 14, 1818 I was in the War office

The date of my original declaration in order to obtain a pension is the 14<sup>th</sup> day of April 1818

The number of my pension certificate is 7145 I have received a Pension. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. My occupation is ~~that of a farmer and not of~~ sufficient ability to pursue it

in family residing with me there is my wife Alice aged 50  
one daughter named Comfort aged 23 years

Their capacity to contribute to their support is my daughter Comfort is not able to support herself more than the contribute anything towards my support
